
## Destinations of Learners - 16+ / 17+ / 18+

We have kept a record of the destinations of all our learners.


We looked at what destinations were chosen at 16+ / The end of Year 11.

In the last three years (July 2021 - July 2023) the destinations of our Yr 11 (16+) learners was as shown




In 2021 and 2022, ALL 16+ Learners opted to Join Braidwood School Sixth Form.

We looked at what destinations were chosen at 17+ / The end of Year 12.


In the last three years (July 2021 - July 2023) the destinations of our Yr 12 (17+) learners was as shown.



In 2021 all 4 Yr 12 Learners opted to stay in Braidwood Sixth Form


In 2022, 4 Learners opted to stay in Braidwood School Sixth Form and 10 Learners opted to go to FE College

We looked at what destinations were chosen at 18+ / The end of Year 13.


In the last three years (July 2021 - July 2023) the destinations of our Yr 13 (18+) learners was as shown.



In 2021 all 9 Yr 13 Learners moved to FE College


In 2022, all 4 Yr 13 Learners moved to FE College

## Destinations of All learners aged 16 - 18+ in 2021/ 2022 / 2023

- In 2021 18 learners **remained** at Braidwood School 9 Learners **moved** to FE College
- In 2022 10 learners **remained** at Braidwood School 14 Learners **moved** to FE College
- In 2023 13 learners **remained** at Braidwood School 7 Learners **moved** to FE College



## An Evaluation

These results show that many learners are happy to stay in the Braidwood School VIth Form and continue their studies with us. Part of this is due to the lack of readiness for a college environment due to low levels of resilience, a lack of awareness of the demands outside of the school environment and low-level social skills. Over the last few years Braidwood has focused on these through targeted intervention, Key Skills development and awareness, work and life skills, SMILE teaching, and increased contact with FE Colleges. One of the Braidwood School Development Targets for 2023/24 specifically targets the resilience of our learners.

Most learners decided to stay at Braidwood to complete their qualifications. All learners leaving school have gone on to FE College. This might be that FE College provides what they need next on their pathway. It has always been the chosen route and continues to be so. However, Braidwood School has embarked on a program educating staff, pupils and parents of the wider range of pathways to include Apprenticeships, Traineeships, Internships and the work of Training Providers. We are encouraging learners to look at ALL options and investigate which would suit them best. We believe that over the coming years we may see some learners choosing these other pathways.
