6. What advice would you give a pupil at Braidwood School about life and work?

Take your time and believe in yourself.

Don't let someone decide your future. Decide for yourself.

As a deaf person, I know that there will be many difficulties and challenges to overcome but I want to show that having a disability has not stopped me doing what I love, and that there is always a way to make it work. I also want to demonstrate to those who think it is impossible, or to those who don't have the confidence, that it can be done. Never give up!
