Introduction



Me plc is a programme originally designed by Rikem Training & Consultancy Ltd which has been further developed by volunteers from the Birmingham Cornerstone Employer Group, who work with Birmingham Careers Hub to support schools in preparing and inspiring young people for the future fast-changing world of work. The employers who helped with this project are Lendlease Construction, Jacobs, Aston Villa Football Club, EY, EY Foundation, Birmingham Education Partnership, Birmingham and Solihull Mental Health NHS Foundation Trust and the Careers and Enterprise Company.

As a result of the uncertainty young people have expressed following the Covid-19 pandemic, the programme has been created to help you prepare to apply for your next step – further education, training, employment, work experience or volunteering. The films and activities guide you through different activities to reflect on:

- your individual story
- who you are and how you want others to see you
- your skills and qualities
- your aspirations

The importance of Information

Imagine you want to buy a new car. There are two cars for sale and they are both good cars but you will need to choose one of them





Which car would you choose?

Why would you choose that car?



The car salesperson has some information for you about each car.

Car 1	Car 2
Price £48,000	Price £25,000
Top Speed - 165 mph	Top Speed - 125 mph
Miles per gallon - 25	Miles per gallon - 38
Safety Rating - 5 stars	Safety Rating - 4 stars
Insurance per year - £1800	Insurance per year - £900
Reliability - 95%	Reliability - 86%

Car 1 is more expensive.

Car 1 has a higher top speed

Car 1 uses more fuel for each mile you drive

Car 1 is the safest car (5 Stars)

Car 1 is more expensive to insure

Car 1 is more reliable

Car 2 is cheaper.

Car 1 has a lower top speed

Car 1 uses less fuel for each mile you drive

Car 1 is not as safe as Car 1 (4 Stars)

Car 1 costs less to insure

Car 1 is less reliable



If can afford a higher price, top speed is important to you and you want a car that is very safe and reliable you would probably choose **Car 1**

However

If you want a car that costs less, top speed isn't important, is cheaper to run and less to insure you would probably choose **Car 2**



The more information we have, the better choices we can make .

Who will get the job?

It is the same with an interview for a college place, a training course or a job.



The boss does not know these people at all. The boss knows that they all have similar qualifications, can see they are all smartly dressed and they were all on time to the interview but that is all.

So how does the boss choose the best person for the job?

The boss needs more information

The best way for the boss to get more information is to talk to each person and ask them questions in an interview.



So, you have an interview.... ...What's next?

Interviews can be very stressful.

Prepare your answers

The boss will often say 'Tell me about yourself!'

This is **your big chance** to tell the boss everything that is great about you. This could give the boss the information they need to make them give you the job.


This is the time for you to sell yourself.



Your Story

It will have a middle.....



Sometimes this information can be seen by other people who would like to know more about you..... even a boss researching you before an interview!


What might a boss think about you if he saw things like this on your social media?

What skills and qualities would you need to do these jobs?



My Pitch

- 4. Make sure you talk about some of your skills and qualities and give examples
- 5. Talk about your aspirations, plans and dreams for the future
